Habitat Builds First Twin Villa in Bonita Springs

Bonita Springs, FL; January 14, 2008 – Habitat for Humanity of Lee County is expanding its production style of homes in the community. The affiliate has traditionally built single-family homes in Lee County, but will now incorporate a twin villa style into its production. The first Habitat for Humanity of Lee County twin villa is already under construction on Nottingham Lane in Bonita Springs. The Bonita Bay Residents raised the walls on the twin villa earlier this year on January 5th. The project will house two low-income families from the Lee County area. “This is new for us. We’ve seen other Habitat affiliates construct this style of home and became interested in the layout and density builds. In terms of land costs, this is a very efficient way to use what land we have. We’ve already had a lot of interest in the villa and we’re very excited to see how the community embraces the project,” says Director of Communications Trisha Goins.

Habitat for Humanity of Lee County is a non-profit organization dedicated to eliminating substandard housing in Lee County. So far, Habitat has built more than 900 homes in Lee County since 1982. Through the use of volunteer labor and donations of money and materials, Habitat builds simple, decent housing for families who otherwise could not afford it. **Homes are sold to the homeowners at no profit on an interest-free mortgage**, making homeownership an affordable reality.
